### MagaBook Students Begin Summer Outreach

Have you noticed the infusion of young people at church? Has your Sabbath School class had to relocate for a few weeks? What is this MagaBook program anyway?

Empowering young people with spreading good news to the community is an important part of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. In the Southern Union Conference, the MagaBook ministry offers students in academies (high school) and universities across the Southern Union the opportunity to meet people one-on-one and share life-changing Christian literature.

The MagaBook ministry also provides a way for young people to earn tuition money for their Christian education. Academy age students receive on average a \$2,500 to \$4,000 scholarship while university students average a scholarship of \$4,000 to \$6,000 every year. These scholarships can significantly reduce the amount of student loans necessary to complete one's education.

The only three requirements are: a desire to grow in Jesus; passing grades in school; a good work record. The program provides: witnessing, Christian fellowship, and Bible study; seminar and field training; food, housing, and local transportation; and school scholarship funds.

We have 20 young people with us this summer, thirteen of which are academy students while the remaining seven are college students. They come from different places all the way from the US Virgin Islands to some locals. They are presently in training with Carolina Conference Publishing Director, David Haugsted and Southern Union Youth Publishing Coordinator, Rocky Davis.

The young people think the Kernersville Church is awesome. They love the accommodations (including the showers), members have been very friendly to them and the gym is a blessing. They were so excited to hear that the church family is praying for them. They ask that we continue to keep them in prayer throughout the summer.

Their daily schedule runs 10:00 a.m. - breakfast/lunch; 11:00 a.m. worship; 12:00 noon training; 1:00 p.m. work; 4:30 p.m. supper/dinner; 5:30 p.m. work; 10:30 p.m. lights out.

As Pastor Don says, "While our Sabbath School classes may have to relocate for a time, while the restrooms may not be in immaculate condition every day, while we may have to adapt to unexpected situations that arise we need to remember that these young people are assisting us in reaching people in our community for Jesus. This is as much our summer outreach ministry as it is theirs. We need to extend Christian love and support to these members of our extended church family who could have easily chosen to do something much different this summer."

# PASTOR'S Perspective

## Preparing for Valley Living



I am sitting on the third floor of the Terrace Hotel looking out at the mountains surrounding Lake Junaluska. The vivid shades of green, along with a few low hanging clouds and the patches of blue sky make for a picture perfect view. In today's high stress world it doesn't surprise me that this beautiful setting is one of the top camp meeting retreats in the United States that both speakers and campers most look forward to attending.

The Bible tells us that Jesus regularly took time away from the pressures of His daily ministry on this planet to spend time alone with His heavenly Father. Luke tells us, "Now it came to pass in those days that He went out to the mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God." (Luke 6:12; see also Mark 1:35 and Luke 5:16)

Jesus knew that the key to success in His ministry was carving out time to spend with God the Father. Jesus needed that mountain top experience to receive spiritual strength, to maintain the proper spiritual perspective by seeking His Father's will and to prepare Himself to be more effective in reaching the lost people He had come to save.

In the same way we need time alone with God in order to live the kind of lives that God has called us to live. Just as we cannot survive spiritually by being hyper busy so we can't spend all of our time living on the spiritual mountain top. There comes a time when we need to leave the mountain top so we can reach the people in the valley below. Christian songwriter Brown Bannister describes this well in his song *Mountain Top*.

I'd love to live on a mountain top  
Fellowshipping with the Lord  
I'd love to stand on a mountain top  
'Cause I love to feel my spirit soar  
But I've got to come down from that mountain top  
To the people in the valley below  
Or they'll never know that they can go  
To the mountain of the Lord



As Jesus was about to make His descent down the Mount of Olives prior to His arrest, trial and crucifixion He saw the lost condition of the people in Jerusalem and Luke says, "He saw the city and wept over it." (Luke 19:41)

In the same way Jesus calls us to feel a burden for the lost people around us. That is why we will be conducting the Quit Now! stop smoking seminar, the Crocodile Dock Vacation Bible School outreach and why we are hosting the student Magabook literature evangelism outreach this summer. Everything that we do is for the purpose of reaching people who need that mountain top experience that only Jesus can provide. May Jesus help us to present the beauty of knowing Him to others!

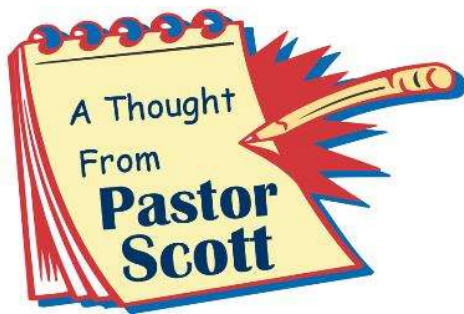


## Intercessory Prayer each Sabbath Morning

A friend of mine, Jonathan Wright, who lives outside of Chicago, is essentially my sole connection with the Indy 500. ## A Thought from Pastor Scott

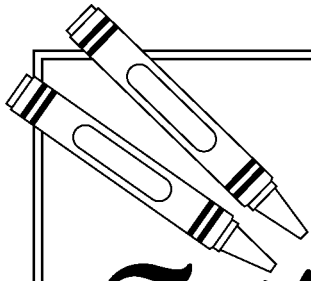

However, the most interesting thing to me about this story is that many times we are like the scrawny man while the devil is like the brawny man. There are times when, after a big spiritual victory, we begin to think that we are invincible and we can take on and defeat the devil. However, instead of being secure in Christ, we just go on as if we can take on Satan in a game of one on one.

Unfortunately, when we are not locked into Jesus, we become exposed and the devil is able to open our door and do much harm to us. The man in the truck was fortunate that the man outside the truck was a forgiving guy. This much I know, if we are not locked into Jesus when Satan comes along, we will be in a dire situation when we face Satan. The only thing we can really do is to be locked into Jesus.

As we think about our spiritual battle, we must understand that Satan is going to attack us. The Bible gives us a clear reminder of what we need to do to be locked into Jesus. Ephesians 6:10-18 tells us to put on the whole armor of God "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 6:12, *ESV*). ## DISCUSSION

The Music Committee met and noted that the church needs six (6) pianos tuned annually. The pianos in the sanctuary and choir room need tuning two (2) times/year and the other four (4) pianos need tuning once (1)/year. They are making the following recommendations:

1. Beth Golden is allowed to exchange her electronic Clavinova piano (no tuning needed) for the choir room piano. She is to bear the expense for having both pianos moved.
2. Make available the Fellowship Hall piano and the youth room piano for a donation of \$150.00. The buyer must safely move the pianos from the building.
